Practice Education (Stage 1)

This module allows candidates to gain a greater understanding of some of the main areas involved in supervising, teaching, mentoring, coaching and assessing social work students. Successful completion of Stage 1 allows learners to progress to the Practice, Teaching & Assessment module which is Stage two of the Practice Educator Professional Requirements (PEPS).

Practice Education (Stage 2)

This module includes an overview of the main areas involved in supervising, teaching, mentoring, coaching and assessing social work students studying qualifying social work programmes.

This module focuses on achieving the Practice Educator Professional Standards.

Teaching

Teaching will be delivered through full day workshops and will focus on the areas highlighted above.

Entry requirements

- At least two years post-registration experience as a social worker registered with the Health and Care Professions Council.

Only those with the required professional qualifications and practice experience will be eligible to enrol on the course.
